KANPUR: Golden Jubilee celebrations of Indian Institute of Technology (IIT-K) commenced from Saturday.

Mentor of Infosys, NR Narayan Murthy, marked the beginning of the celebrations by striking a brass gong six times inside the auditorium of the Institute. Murthy also unveiled the Golden Jubilee Stone.

Distinguished guests along with two first year students, Avani Garg and Tushar Garg, as representatives of students, lighted the lamp.

Chairman of the Board of Governors M Anandakrishnan, NR Narayana Murthy, director of IIT-K Dr Sanjay G Dhande and Deputy Director of the Institute Dr RK Thareja signed the scroll which was to be kept in the time capsule to be buried in the campus during the jubilee celebrations.

A 45 minutes documentary directed by Sunil Shanbag was also screened on the occasion.

The documentary traced the complete journey of the institute from its modest beginning at the Harcourt Butler technological Institute (HBTI) campus to its present day, covering both, the bitter and the sweet moments.

One scene showed the first computer of the institute being

carried to the campus on a bullock-cart, in 1960.

At the same time there were also scenes of the two-day total strike by IIT-K employees during recession in 1980 which had disrupted the life at the institute.

Apart from the documentary, a visual story providing pictorial narratives of the development of the Institute over the last fifty years was also screened.
