In the past four years, the number of Indians studying in Germany has increased three times and has risen from 1412 in 2001 to 4249 in 2005. After China and Republic of Korea, India was the third largest Asian country which sent a large number of students to Germany.

The members said the number of Indian students studying in Germany was expected to increase further in future. U Podewils said, "It is not the quantity that counts, our object is to attract only the brightest students."
